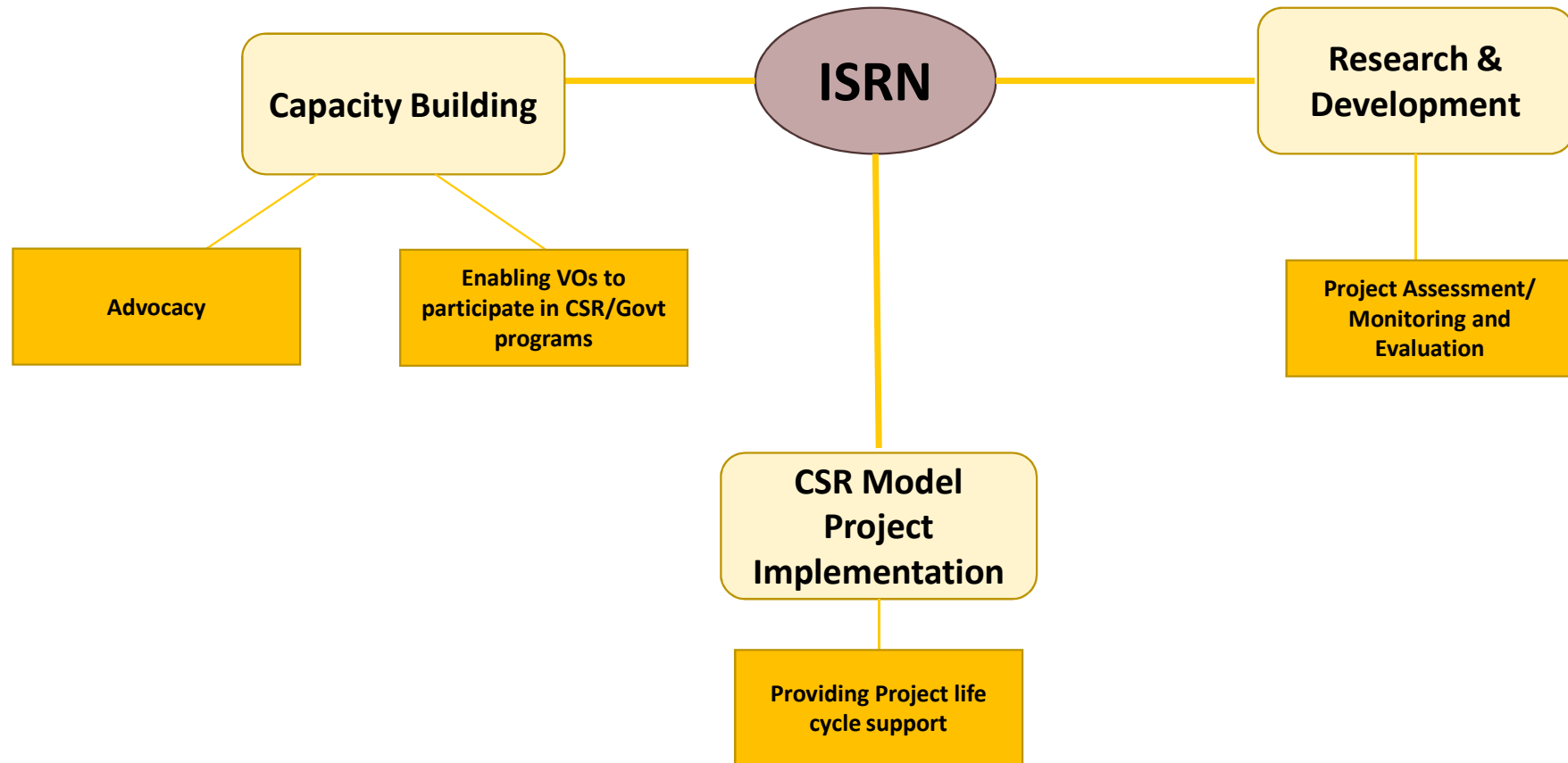


ISRN: A Brief Introduction

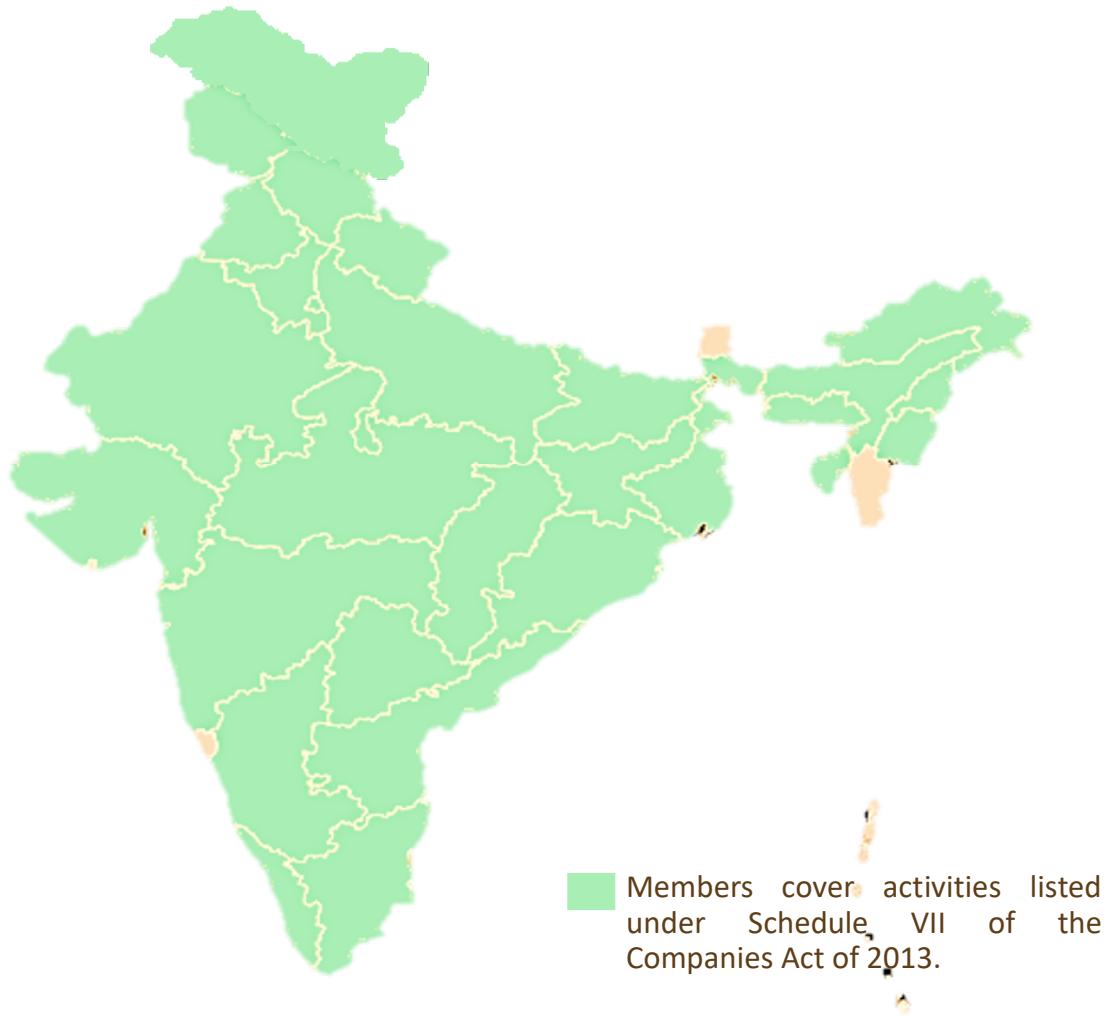
*Founded with a philosophy of

- Registered under the Indian Trusts Act of 1882
- a not-for-profit multi-dimensional facilitation network in the domain of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) and sustainable development.
- **Vision** – To facilitate the effective channelization of efforts, skills, resources and outreach of the corporate, Voluntary Organizations (VOs) and the Government, to contribute to the overall development of Indian society.
- **Mission** - To facilitate synchronization of efforts between the stakeholders in development viz. corporate, government, voluntary organizations and the community for sustainable development of the nation through leveraging and strengthening the CSR initiatives and government development programs.

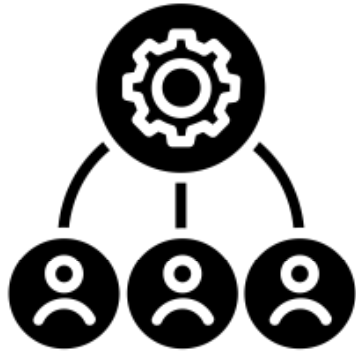

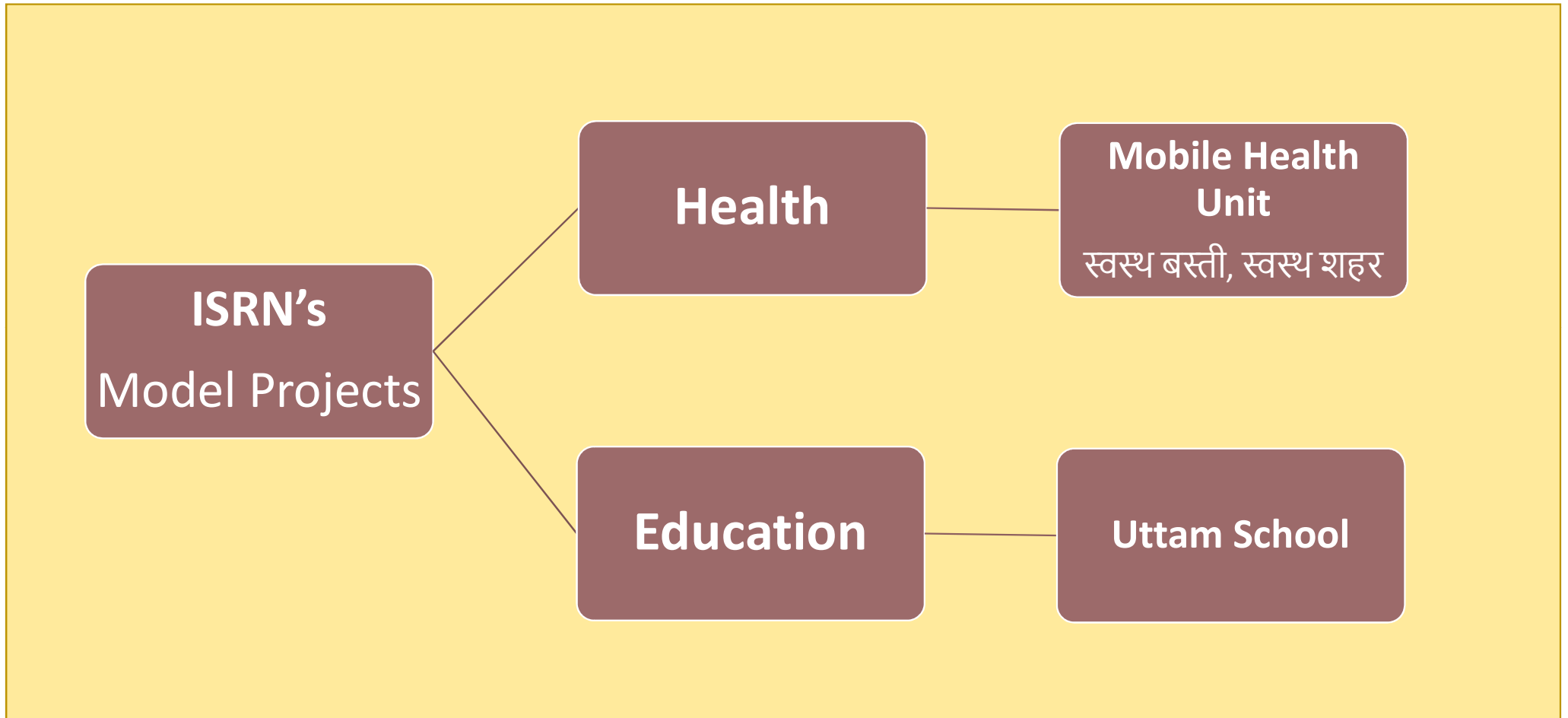
Research and Development

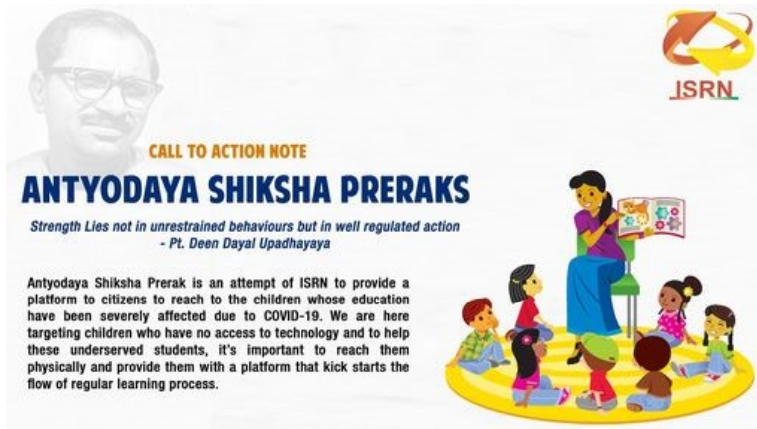
